Polish furniture – lemon juice and olive oil

Window and glass washing – Newspapers and vinegar and water. I can attest I have used this remedy for the last few months and my windows and all glass and mirrors have never sparkled so clearly.

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VISION ZERO

1 TRAFFIC DEATH IS TOO MANY

A Vision Zero policy establishes a goal of reducing traffic fatalities and serious injuries to zero, typically by a target date. Here in Hillsborough County, a "Vision Zero" goal resolution has been adopted by the Tampa City Council, Hillsborough County Commission, Temple Terrace City Council, and by the School Board of Hillsborough County. The MPO Policy Committee, along with many partners, are in the process of developing a Vision Zero Action Plan in 2016 and 2017.

Vision Zero is an approach to road safety that began in Sweden and has been implemented in that country since 1997. At the core of the worldwide Vision Zero movement is the belief that death and injury on city streets is preventable - in other words, that these aren't "accidents," but the result of poor behaviors combined with unforgiving roadway designs.

Several U.S. cities have adopted Vision Zero, including
New York, Chicago, Washington DC, Seattle, Austin, and San Diego.

Residents, businesspeople, health professionals, representatives of the media, law enforcement, schools, local governments, and others are invited to collaborate on the steps needed to take traffic safety to the next level in our community. *Please come join us !*

The City of Tampa is exploring a future for the streetcar as a true transportation option for residents, visitors, and employees in the downtown core. With this objective in mind, the City is conducting a public transportation feasibility study for the extension and modernization of the current system. The goal of this planning process, which is called InVision: Tampa Streetcar, is to take the first step towards creating a viable transportation choice for people who live, work or visit downtown. The first phase of InVision: Tampa Streetcar is expected to be complete in early Summer 2017. If the results of the feasibility analysis are positive, a second phase will be initiated to select a preferred alternative and refine improvement plans and strategies.
