DO

- ✓ Put oil and grease in collection containers
- ✓ Remove oil and grease from kitchen utensils, equipment, and food preparation areas with scrapers/towels/brooms
- ✓ Keep grease out of wash water
- ✓ Place food scraps in collection containers

DO NOT

- ✗ Pour oil and grease down drains
- ✗ Wash fryers/griddles, pots/pans, and plates with water until oil and grease are removed
- ✗ Use hot water to line grease off surfaces
- ✗ Put food scraps down drains

Help keep this out of our drains and in the hands of the proper authorities!
