## Don't Feed the Ease Oblinn!

### DO

✓ Put oil and Ease in collection containers

✓ Remove oil and Ease from kitchen utensils, equipment, and food preparation areas with scrapers/towels/brooms

✓ Keep Ease out of wash water

✓ Place food scraps in collection containers

### DO NOT

✗ Pour oil and Ease down drains

✗ Wash fryers/griddles, pots/pans, and plates with water until oil and Ease are removed

✗ Use hot water to rinse Ease off surfaces

✗ Put food scraps down drains

Help keep this out of our drains and in the hands of the proper authorities!
