Re: Request for Disposal of Transported Waste at the Howard F. Curren Wastewater Treatment Plant.

In order to accommodate your request to dispose wastewater at our facility, please complete the enclosed Transported Waste Discharge Permit Application and return it to the address printed on the application.

Upon approval, an account will be set up for monthly billing to your company for actual quantities of wastewater disposed. The cost will be \$7.00 per load plus actual treatment costs. The treatment costs will be determined by random samples collected and analyzed by our laboratory. Certain extra strength wastewater pollutants are subject to surcharges.

For the City of Tampa to accommodate the disposal of transported waste, the following specific conditions must be adhered to:

- 1) Only wastewaters generated within the City of Tampa service area are permitted to be disposed at the Howard F. Curren facility (unless expressly authorized otherwise by the City of Tampa).
- 2) Absolutely no wastes from septic tanks (unless expressly authorized by the City of Tampa), grease traps, food service separators, or chemical tanks are allowed to be disposed at the Howard F. Curren facility, nor are any trucks containing residual wastes from such to be used for transporting the wastewater.
- 3) Transported waste will only be accepted at the wastewater treatment facility between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Wastewater may be disposed of after hours, weekends, or holidays if <u>prior approval</u> is obtained from the Industrial Waste section. All drivers must report to the main office <u>before</u> dumping to certify the quantity, quality, and source of the wastewater being discharged. Wastewater may be accepted after hours on an emergency basis if the operations center is notified by phone (247-3451) <u>prior</u> to the drivers' arrival.
- 4) The discharge of wastewater at the city's treatment facility must take place in a clean and orderly manner, and a hose must be used at all times. All wastewater and rinse water shall be contained on the drain pad. Under no circumstances should any wastes be allowed to spill or leak onto the roadway. Each hauler is responsible for providing their own hoses, fittings, etc., necessary to discharge directly to an 8" drain.
- 5) The wastewater will be sampled and analyzed periodically for billing purposes and compliance monitoring. Bills will be sent by our Customer Service division on a monthly basis.
- 6) Chemical disinfectants must be approved by the department prior to use. Any change in the chemical used for disinfection must be approved prior to use.
- 7) The Industrial Waste section shall be notified of any changes involving a hauler company's name, address, phone number, or contact person within 30 days of such change. Permits are not transferable.
- 8) Safe vehicle operation will be expected on the plant site.

Violation of any of these conditions could result in the loss of dumping privileges, in addition to penalties outlined in Chapter 26 of the City of Tampa Code.

- 4. Clearly indicate any information as "planned," "estimated," "typically," "projected," etc., if that information does not represent current or actual activities at the time you sign and date this application.

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SECTION G. SIGNATORY REQUIREMENTS

This application must be signed by a duly authorized representative of the user:

- 1. If the user is a corporation:
- (a) The president, secretary, treasurer, or a vice-president of the corporation in charge of a principal business function, or any other person who performs similar policy or decision making functions for the corporation; or
- (b) The manager of one or more manufacturing, production, or operating facilities providing the manager is authorized to make management decisions that govern the operation of the regulated facility including having the explicit or implicit duty of making major capital investment recommendations, and initiate and direct other comprehensive measures to assure long-term environmental compliance with environmental laws and regulations; can ensure that the necessary systems are established or actions taken to gather complete and accurate information for individual wastewater discharge permit requirements; and where authority to sign documents has been assigned or delegated to the manager in accordance with corporate procedures.
- 2. If the user is a partnership or sole proprietorship: a general partner or proprietor, respectively.
- 3. If the user is a Federal, State, or local government facility: a director or highest official appointed or designated to oversee the operations and performance of the activities of the government facility, or their designee.
- 4. The individuals described in paragraphs 1 through 3, above, may designate a duly authorized representative if the authorization is in writing, the authorization specifies the individual or position responsible for the overall operation of the facility from which the discharge originates or having overall responsibility for environmental matters for the company, and the written authorization is submitted to the city.

"I certify under penalty of law that this document and all attachments were prepared under my direction or supervision in accordance with a system designed to assure that qualified personnel properly gather and evaluate the information submitted. Based on my inquiry of the person or persons who manage the system, or those persons directly responsible for gathering the information, the information submitted is, to the best of my knowledge and belief, true, accurate, and complete.
