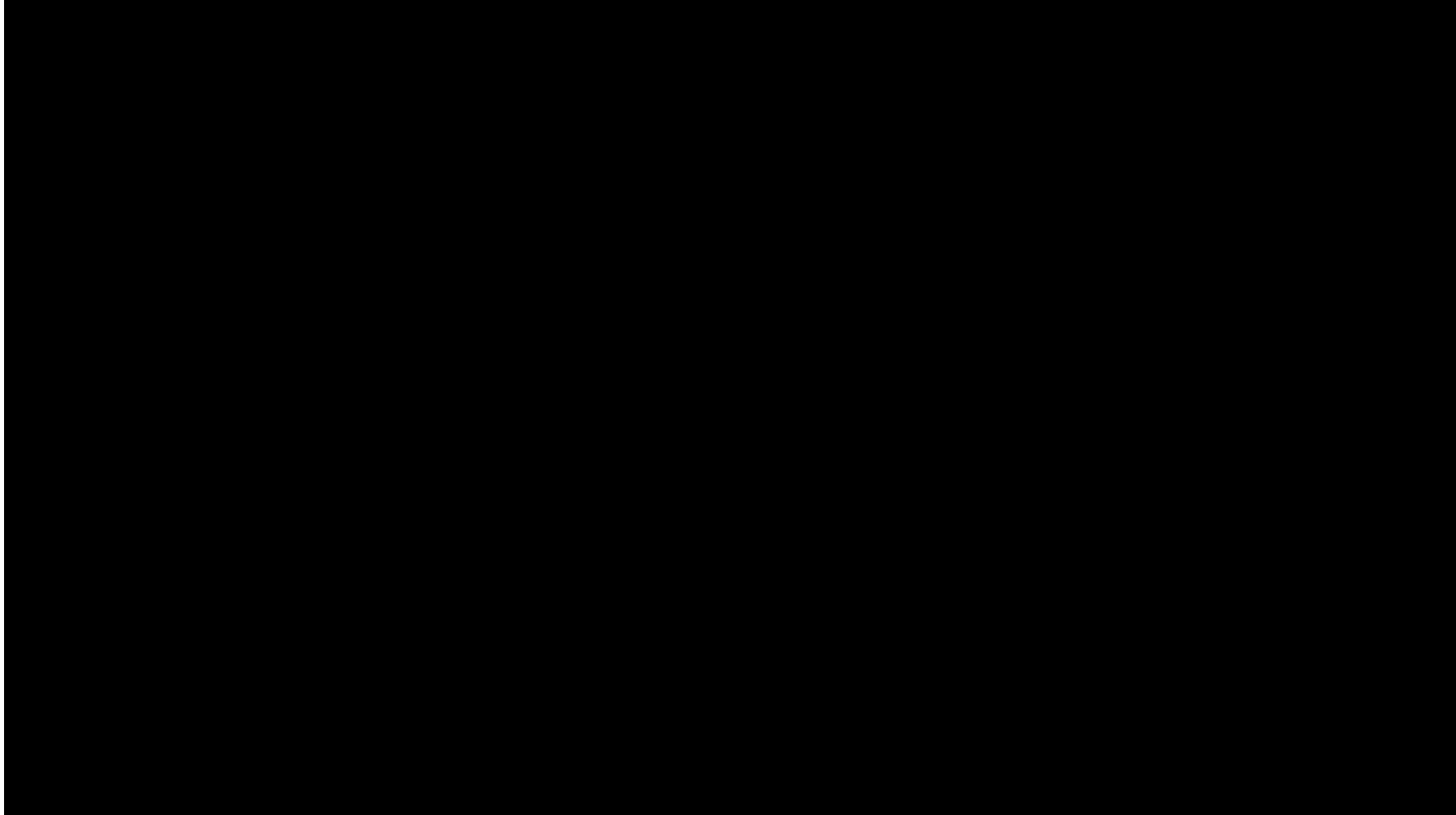

PARKS & RECREATION

- 62% of residents live within a 10 minute walk of a park (national average is 54%)

Tampa Park amenities compared to the 100 Largest U.S. Cities*:

- ✓ 4 Dog Parks per 100,000 people – 95th percentile
- ✓ 1.9 Recreation and Senior Centers per 20,000 people – 95th percentile
- ✓ 2.8 Bathrooms per 10,000 people – 80th percentile
- ✓ 2.6 Splashpads per 100,000 people – 77th percentile
- ✓ 2.3 Playgrounds per 10,000 people – 46th percentile
