




Survey Exercise Summary

The survey was titled "What Improvements Do You Want to See in West Tampa?" and listed various examples of improvements under 7 categories to be checked









Taxable Value Assumptions:

- •5% annual growth rate for base values -- \$261 million added by FY28
- •Value of new/planned North Hyde Park projects -- \$147 million added by FY28
- Value of West River Redevelopment -- \$56 million added by FY28

Total Increased Taxable Value -- \$464 million added by FY28



Final Steps of SAP Adoption

- 1. Receive feedback from CAC on DRAFT SAP
- 2. Present to the public for input
- 3. Revise SAP based on CAC comments
- 4. Submit to CAC for approval
- 5. Submit to CRA Board for adoption
