A RESOLUTION MAKING CERTAIN CHANGES IN THE BUDGET OF THE CITY OF TAMPA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2021; APPROVING THE TRANSFER, REALLOCATION, AND/OR APPROPRIATION OF \$11,923,755 WITHIN THE EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM GRANT FUND TO ASSIST CITY OF TAMPA RESIDENTS AFFECTED BY THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Section 1. The transfer, reallocation, and/or appropriation of the sum of \$11,923,755 within the Emergency Rental Assistance Program Grant Fund, as set forth below, is hereby approved.
