Introduction


- Second iteration of study for the City of Tampa's strategic priorities for the community
- Can trend metrics from baseline study conducted in 2020
- Goal: to obtain statistically valid information that is reflective of the diverse demographics of the City and its various communities
- Additionally, the survey explored topics pertaining to *Transforming Tampa's Tomorrow (T3):*
 - Transportation
 - Workforce Development
 - Housing Affordability
 - Sustainability and Resilience




Methodology

- Total respondents: 1,300 City of Tampa residents aged 18+
- Margin of error: ±2.71% at a 95% confidence level
- Data collection: July 9, 2021 through August 21, 2021
- Telephonic survey using both landlines and cellphones
- Average length of survey: 14 minutes
- Five respondent demographics were controlled: age, gender, race/ethnicity, educational attainment, and homeownership status








Study Regions


 Data was segmented into six regions to provide analysis of different parts of the city


In which of the categories does your current age fall?




Which option most closely describes your race?




How long have you been a City of Tampa resident?



How would you describe your gender?




Do you have children under the age of 18 living in your household full-time?





Into what range does your annual household income fall?






How much trust and confidence do you have in the City of Tampa's government when it comes to handling issues in the City?








Handling Community Items

- The average score is 8.50 among all categories


Experience

- Question Phrasing: In your personal experience, how has the City of Tampa delivered on these characteristics? Use a 10point scale where 10 represents very well, and 1 represents not well at all.
- The average score is 6.97 among all categories

Expectation Gap

- Calculated as (Importance Experience)
- A higher expectation gap is a bad thing
- The average expectation gap is 1.53



Do you rent or own your current City of Tampa residence?









Let's talk about walkability. Do you regularly walk to run errands, visit businesses, or commute to work?




In your view, what improvements could be made in the city that would encourage people in your local area to walk to work or run errands more often?




Two Wheels

What about things like bikes and scooters? Do you regularly bike or scoot to run errands, visit businesses, or commute to work?




In your view, what improvements could be made in the city that would encourage people in your local area to bike or scoot to work or run errands more often?

Which of the following are reasons that you do not use public transit more often?










For approximately how many months have you been looking for a job?





Final Thoughts



Conclusion

- Trust in the City of Tampa improved markedly from 2020 to 2021
- Levels of recommendation are flat, except for opening a business, which saw a sizable improvement
- Residents feel that the city has improved its handling of both COVID and city issues; they
 also feel that the city is prepared for hurricanes, floods and other natural disasters
- Residents' expectations have changed substantially in just one year:
 - Roads, Affordable Housing, Personal Safety, and DEI issues have risen sharply in expectation
 - Career-related issues and Public transit have dropped sharply in expectation
- Traffic Flow, Quality Roads, and Affordable Housing are now the top three expectations
- Homeowners in the City have similar priorities to those in unincorporated Hillsborough County, prioritizing housing size and affordability over commutes
 - In contrast, renters prioritize location and affordability, caring substantially less about housing size
- A majority of current renters (60%) believe that they could find a home for sale in Tampa that meets their requirements
- The number one improvement that residents believe would encourage more walking and biking is for the city to increase enforcement of traffic laws; generally speaking, most ideas ultimately relate to separating vehicular traffic from other traffic
