Committee #3 of the Board of Trustees of the City Pension Fund for Firefighters and Police Officers in the City of Tampa met remotely on Tuesday, April 12, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. regarding various policies, with the following members present: h

Also present was Mr. Robert Klausner, General Counsel. h

The committee briefly discussed policy 801, regarding pension verification questionnaires (PVQs). Ms. Weberh stated that the policy needs to reference MemberDirect as an option to complete the biennial PVQ. *The recommendation to amend Policy 801 was agreed upon by general consensus.* h

Regarding policy 814, which speaks to pensioner addresses, Ms. Weberh informed the committee that this policy needs to reference MemberDirect as an option for address updates and to remove the option to update an address via the Fund's website. *The recommendation to amend Policy 814 was agreed upon by general consensus.* h

The committee discussed policy 439, which is the Fund's buyback policy. Ms. Weberh noted that the reference to the \$350 fee needs to be removed now that the new pension system is live. Additionally, she recommended that the expiration date should be shortened from 6 months to 30 days, as these are done on demand. She further commented that service credit for buybacks is awarded incrementally now and the policy should be updated to reference that change. *The recommendation to amend Policy 439 was agreed upon by general consensus.* h

Ms. Weberh advised the committee of how service credit is calculated in the pension system and asked to include language in policy 901, which would be amended to include both Final Average Salary (FAS) and Service Credit, to address this calculation and how potential discrepancies would be handled. *The recommendation to amend Policy 901 was agreed upon by general consensus.* h

The committee discussed holdover options for when a trustee retires or enters DROP. It was noted that this should be added to policy 806, which addresses elections. Ms. Weberh noted this policy should be updated to reference MemberDirect as an option for voting in elections. *The recommendation to amend Policy 806 was agreed upon by general consensus.* h


Ms. Weberh noted that policy 424 – the Fund's DROP policy – needs to be updated to reference changes to the pension contract regarding the time to hold an election. *The recommendation to amend Policy 424 was agreed upon by general consensus.* h


The committee began discussing policy 402 regarding disability applications. After a brief discussion, *it was agreed upon by general consensus to table Policy 402 until a future meeting.* h

Ms. Weberh advised the committee of a surviving spouse who has a medically dependent adult child. Mr. Klausner discussed how other funds operate in this regard. After discussion by the committee, language expanding the definition of minor child was added to policy 414, which discusses payments h

of pension benefits, and the policy 432, which addresses the poverty level provision. *The recommendation to amend Policy 414 and Policy 432 was agreed upon by general consensus.*

Motion to adjourn was made at 11:56 a.m.
