








Project Map Overview









Option 1: Shared Use Path

- The FIX IT FAST program focuses on processes that deliver timely repairs.
 - Roadway defects such as <u>potholes</u> and <u>asphalt delaminations</u> are repaired within 3 business days of notification.
 - <u>Critical sign repairs</u> and <u>obstructions</u> such as STOP signs and one-way signs are repaired within **2 hours** of notification.
 - <u>Common sign repairs</u> such as speed limit and parking signs are repaired within
 2 business days of notification.
 - The FIX IT FAST hotline is open 24/7 to address urgent concerns that require immediate attention.



Over 2000 FIX IT FAST service requests have been completed in FY2023!
