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PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project provides for capacity, operational, safety and complete streets improvement on Armenia Ave from south of W Humphrey St to Sewaha St. The project lengthens the existing left turn lane and adds a second through lane to minimize vehicular congestion and time spent idling at the intersection waiting for the traffic signal. Proposed improvements include:

- 1. Lengthening the northbound left-turn lane;
- Addition of a second northbound through lane starting at Okaloosa Ave;
- 3. Lengthening the southbound right-turn lane;
- 4. Addition of sidewalk north of railroad track;
- Addition of standard driveways with curb and gutter and sidewalk at adjacent businesses;
- 6. Reconstruction of the traffic signals; and,
- 7. Reconstruction of the existing railroad grade crossing, railroad gates and rail signals.

BENEFITS TO THE COMMUNITY

- Improved intersection safety through the implementation of traffic calming measures, ditch enclosures, and resurfacing to improve the pavement condition.
- Improved roadway and bicycle connectivity through drainage ditch enclosures, sidewalk installation, and provision of a continuous bicycle lane through the project intersection.
