# **ACCEPTED ITEMS**

### tampa.gov/Recycle



#### **PAPER**

Junkmail, office paper, newspaper, magazines, paper bags, postcards, paperback books



**NO** shredded paper, plates, hardcover books, receipts or napkins/paper towels

#### **PAPERBOARD**

Paper towel rolls and toilet paper rolls, boxes, and egg cartons



**NO** plastic-lined items such as beverage cartons, cups or ice cream tubs

#### **CARDBOARD**

Flattened and loosely inside of cart (jammed in boxes may not fall out for service)



**NO** wet cardboard, foam/plastic packaging or pizza/soiled food boxes

Beverage, shampoo, bodywash, condiment, cleaning product

#### **PLASTIC BOTTLES**

Beverage, detergent, cleaning product

#### **PLASTIC JUGS**



**NO** caps, food or liquid residue, spray nozzles/ pumps, or other plastic items of any kind

Beverage and food

## TIN/ALUMINUM CANS AND BOTTLES

NO food or liquid residue, detached can lids, aerosol cans, or other metal items of any kind



Beverage and food

### GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS

**NO** corks, food or liquid residue, or other glass items of any kind



All items must be larger than the size of your fist.



Not all items labeled for recycling or with the chasing arrows symbol are accepted.



Avoid **Wishcycling**: tossing questionable items in your recycling cart and hoping it gets recycled.



Only the items pictured above are accepted in your curbside recycling cart.

Below are a few unaccepted items that commonly get placed in the recycling cart.













**REMEMBER:** 

Clean (no food or liquid residue), recyclable items should be loose in the cart and not bagged.
