I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

II. ROLL CALL

Mr. Hill, Chairman, presiding, brought the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Hill requested the Board approve the meeting minutes from April 18, 2023.

MOTION: Steve Kenny made motion to approve the Minutes. Jonette Socali seconded the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

V. INVESTMENT CONSULTANT REPORT

ACG provided an update on capital markets, an update regarding the first quarter 2023, and the monthly performance report for the period ending 4/30/2023.



The one-year gross return of the Total Fund as of 3/31/2023 was -5.31%, versus the Policy Index returns of -5.49%. The Fund ranked in the 62nd percentile of the Public Fund Universe for the same time-period. The trailing ten-year annualized gross return of the Total Fund as of 3/31/2023 was 7.15% which ranks in the top 48% of all Public Pension Funds for that time-period. The Policy Index was up 6.76% for the same timeframe.

As of April 30, 2023, the total fund value stood at approximately \$754.8 million. Fiscal Year-to-Date through April 30, 2023, the fund has returned 11.21% gross of fees while the Policy Index has returned 11.90% for the same period. Over the five-year period ending April 30, 2023, the Fund is up 5.99% gross of fees annualized compared to the policy index of 5.86% for the same period. On a ten-year basis, the portfolio is up 6.97% versus 6.60% for the Policy Index.

ACG recommended sourcing the Plan's \$5.3 million May liquidity needs from JP Morgan Strategic Income.

MOTION: Steve Kenny made motion to source May liquidity as \$5.3 million from JP Morgan Strategic Income. Javier Moreno seconded the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

ACG provided an update on Private Equity planning and commitment pacing, along with a recommendation for two additional Private Equity Investments. Both commitments were approved by the Board.

MOTION: Javier Moreno made motion to hire TrueBridge Secondaries I Fund and TrueBridge Capital Partners Fund VIII Fund each in the amount of \$10 million, subject to contract negotiation. Steve Kenny seconded the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

VI. ACTUARIAL REPORT

Amanda Brown of Foster & Foster presented the Actuarial Valuation Report.

MOTION: Steve Kenny made motion to accept the Actuarial Valuation Report. Javier Moreno seconded the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Economic Overview

- Concerns over the US debt celling dominated headlines, though a deal was in place and advancing through Congress by month-end
- The US Fed increased the policy rate by 25 bps, while messaging from Fed Chairman Powell suggested the potential for a pause ahead
- CPI fell to an annual increase of 4.9%, marginally less than estimated, however core PCE, the Fed's preferred gauge, rose from 4.6% to 4.7%


Market Returns


Average Annual Return Assumptions (Next 10 Years)



Tech Performance Drives S&P 500 YTD Gains





DROP Payout Calculations for the Period Ending March 31, 2023 And Paid Out on June 30, 2023

Background:

The Deferred Retirement Option Program (DROP) allows an eligible General Employee to defer receipt of retirement benefits while continuing employment with the City of Tampa. They may elect to participate in the program for up to seven (7) years and must terminate employment upon exiting the DROP. Upon the election to participate in the DROP, the amount of continuous service and average monthly salary becomes frozen for purposes of determining pension benefits. The employee is considered a retired member for all purposes related to the General Employees Retirement Fund and will not accrue additional retirement benefits, except for cost-of-living adjustments (COLA), if applicable. The monthly retirement benefits that the member would have received if they had stopped working are credited monthly to a DROP account. Upon separation from City employment, the employee will receive the DROP account balance and will begin receiving the monthly retirement benefit.

GE Option 2 - For Period Ending 03/31/2023 the Rate is 2.61%

Daily Rate - For Period Ending 06/01/2023 the Rate is .01369%
