She graduated from Plant City High School with honors and was named PCHS Girl of the Year. Maruchi earned both a BA and an MBA (cum laude) from the University of Florida, where she became the first Hispanic woman selected to the UF Student Hall of Fame. Appointed by Mayor Sandra Freedman in 1987, she served on the Mayor's Hispanic Advisory Council and chaired it from 1992–2001. She was the founding chair of the Latinos Unidos Luncheon in 1998 and co-chaired the 20th Anniversary Luncheon in 2018.



MARIA M. BERMUDEZ-TORRES
