 Receive guidance from the CAC on which alleyway concept(s) to select for a pilot improvement project



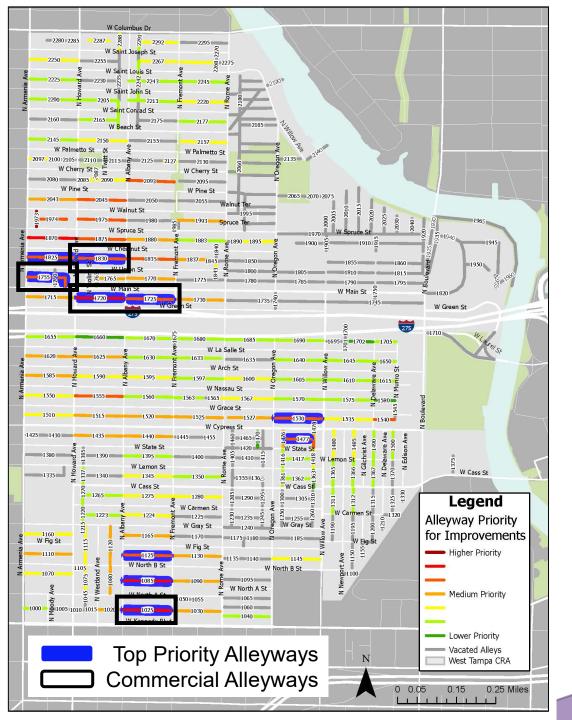


Where We've Been – Project Status

- May 2024: Project Team presented to the CAC and received guidance on which alleyways should be prioritized for improvement – 10 alleyways were selected
- Summer 2024: Developed conceptual designs for priority alleyway improvements and estimated Planning Level Costs
- August 2024: Priority Alleyway Concepts presented to the West Tampa Chamber of Commerce to receive feedback from the business community
- September 2024: Conducted site visits to the priority alleyways to gather additional data and photos
- Fall/Winter 2024: Continued development and revisions to the Priority Alleyway concepts

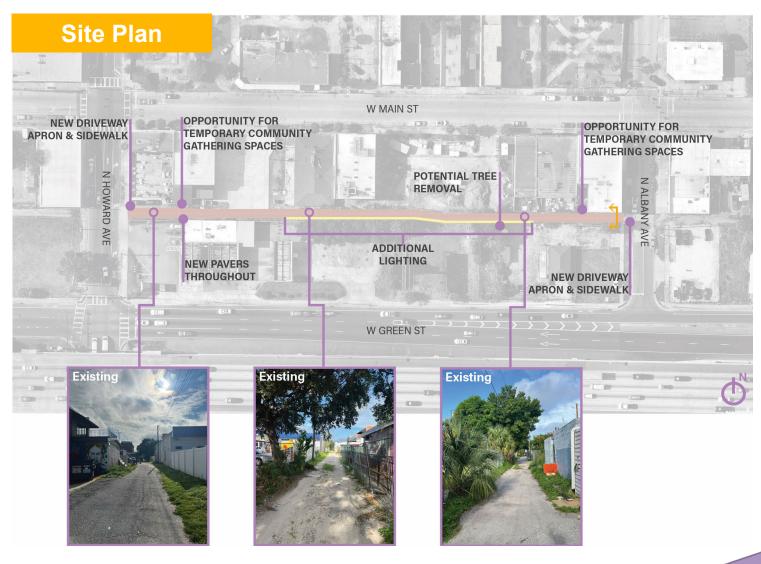
Priority Alleyway Pilot Project Concepts

Primary Improvements:

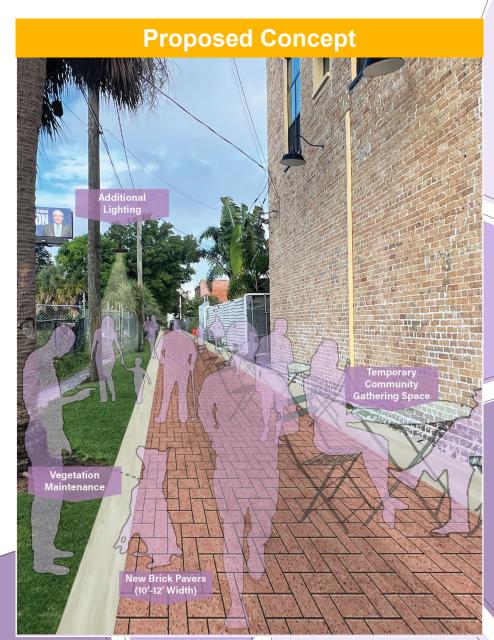
- New pavement (Asphalt or Brick)
- Additional lighting
- Pavement murals
- Reconstruct alleyway driveway aprons

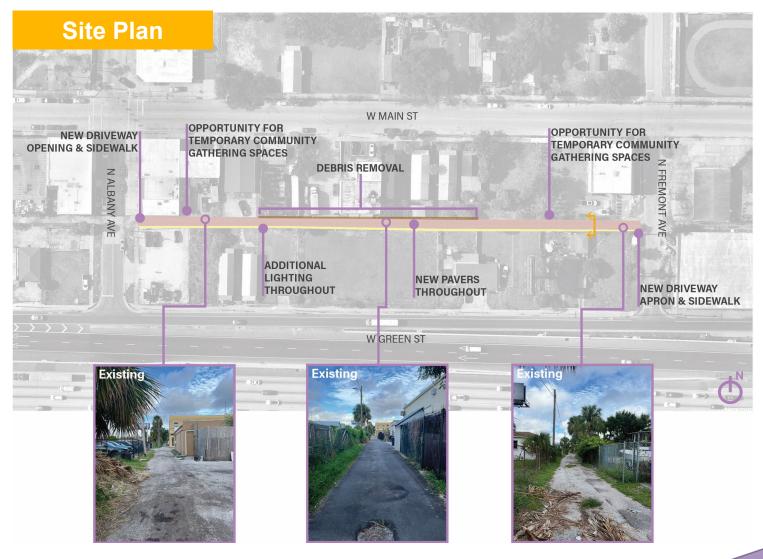
 Reconstruct existing driveway aprons in the alleyways that are within public ROW

Note: The following renderings are conceptual designs and were developed to show a range of improvements that may be appropriate for a particular alleyway. These are not to be interpreted as final design drawings. Cost estimates were developed to inform decision-making based on available funding. Actual costs may differ based on the improvements and materials selected in the design phase. Cost estimates do not include design services, escalation, or ongoing operating/maintenance costs.



Estimated Cost: \$375,000 - \$950,000





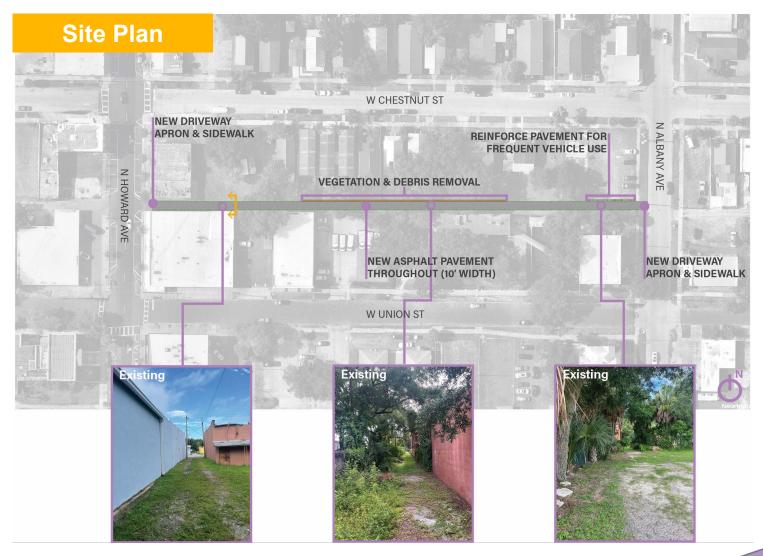
Estimated Cost: \$470,000 - \$1,175,000
