The Tampa Police Department was represented by Chief of Police Lee Bercaw, Criminal Investigations Division Major Eric DeFelice, Captain of Professional Standards Lisa Purcell, Captain of Community Outreach Brian Hill, Lieutenant Robin Polk, Corporal Robert Suddler and Master Police Officer Richard Fujimoto.

Chief Lee provided an overview of the department's community outreach efforts, including specialized programs, liaison officer initiatives, and safety programs. He also introduced the Virtual Reality (VR) training system developed for the newly issued TASER 10, discussed officer wellness initiatives, and announced the hiring of twenty-two new officers.

Major Eric Defelice briefed the panel on the comprehensive officer wellness program, highlighting mental and physical health resources and peer support efforts designed to help officers manage high-stress situations.

Lieutenant Robin Polk presented updates on the Behavioral Health Unit, community engagement initiatives, the School Resource Officer program, the Explorer Program, and the Police Athletic League.

Lieutenant Robin Polk and Captain Lisa Purcell jointly discussed Officer Wellness Program offerings, including trauma management resources, stress-reduction strategies, and physical health services aimed at improving overall officer well-being.

Corporal Robert Suddler and Master Police Officer Richard Fujimoto demonstrated the TASER 10 VR training system and conducted a tour of the AXON training pods.

No panel members had any questions or additional input from the previous topic of the Tampa Police Department Communications presentation.


VIII. Future Meeting
