The Charter Review Commission of the City of Tampa, Florida convened in a regular meeting in the Sister Cities Room at Old City Hall, 315 E. Kennedy Boulevard, First Floor, at 6:00p.m. on the 24th day of March 2026. The Zoom meeting was live streamed recorded and available on YouTube, and minutes were prepared by Tonia Wilcox, Senior City Council/City Clerk Support Specialist, Office of the City Clerk.

Guest Speakers Melissa Zornitta and Yassert Gonzalez Hillsborough Planning Commission

Facilitator Robert Hendrickson introduced Melissa Zornitta. Yassert Gonzalez gave a presentation regarding Tampa Demographic Trends & Redistricting and answered questions from CRC members. At the conclusion, the Facilitator and CRC members thanked Mr. Gonzalez for the presentation.

Review and Discuss Potential Amendments to the Tampa City Charter (Sections 3 and 4.01)

The Facilitator led the CRC through a discussion of section 3.01 and 4.01. In summary, the CRC had no changes to section 3.1 (five of nine CRC members preferred to leave the section unchanged). For section 4.01, the Facilitator utilized a whiteboard to take notes covering recommended changes, items requiring clarification, and action items for follow up. Attached to the minutes at Exhibit A are the whiteboard notes.

Discussion

The members discussed and expressed their views of historical City issues related to the separation of legislative and executive powers and city investigative practices. The Facilitator provided a recap regarding the charter action items, and how the CRC is progressing with its review.
