Important Notes

If you have previously registered your license with the City of Tampa and cannot retrieve it in Accela, your license or insurance certificate has likely expired.

Contractors are responsible for submitting updated license and insurance information.

Licensing requirements are managed exclusively at the state level by the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR), rather than by local City of Tampa offices.



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State Certified Contractors – New Registration

STATE CERTIFIED CONTRACTORS - NEW REGISTRATION

Certified contractor means any contractor who possesses a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) or other State of Florida Regulatory Agency and who shall be allowed to contract in any jurisdiction in the state without being required to fulfill additional competency requirements within that jurisdiction.

SCN1. Copy of Florida State License.

SCN2. Certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance or proof of exemption.

SCN3. Contractor's [Letter of Authorization](#) (when required).

QUICK TIPS

Signature Requirements

The Contractor must sign the Letter of Authorization in the presence of a notary public.

When Required

A Contractor's Letter of Authorization is required if the license holder wishes to designate another person to obtain permits on his/her behalf.

Important Note

Florida Certified contractors registered with the DBPR must renew their licenses August 31st of even numbered years.



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State Registered Contractors – New Registration

STATE REGISTERED CONTRACTORS - NEW REGISTRATION

Registered contractor means any contractor who has registered with the DBPR pursuant to fulfilling the competency requirements in the jurisdiction for which the registration is issued. Registered contractors may contract only in such jurisdictions.

As of 7/1/2021, all local licensure will be pre-empted by the State pursuant to [House Bill 735](#). State Registered Contractors, under certain circumstances, have an option to transfer their license to a State Certified status (“grandfather”). Contractors already active with Hillsborough County may continue to register their existing license with the City of Tampa until June 30, 2023 (per House Bill 735). STATE REGISTERED CONTRACTORS - LICENSE UPDATE

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Specialty Contractors – New Registration

SPECIALTY CONTRACTORS - NEW REGISTRATION

Specialty contractor means a contractor who is not required to register with Florida DBPR and whose scope of work and responsibility is limited to a particular phase of construction established in a category adopted by board rule and whose scope is limited to a subset of activities. Types include, but are not limited to, fire contractors, specialty contractors, paver contractors, and tree service contractors.

As of 7/1/2021, all local licensure will be pre-empted by the State pursuant to [House Bill 735](#). Please refer to Hillsborough County's License Comparison and Contractor Licensing to determine how your license is affected.

Contractors already active with Hillsborough County may continue to register their existing license with the City of Tampa until June 30, 2023 (per House Bill 735). Please refer to Hillsborough Contractor Licensing to determine how your license is affected thereafter.

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Tree Services – New Registration

TREE SERVICES - NEW REGISTRATION

A tree service company employs arborists and provides services such as tree removal, trimming, stump removal, and lot clearing.

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Workers' Compensation

WORKERS' COMPENSATION

The City of Tampa only requires the submission of Workers' Compensation Insurance or proof of exemption status (no liability certificates are needed).

IU1. Copy of Workers' Compensation Insurance Certificate.

IU2. If contractor's license is not already printed on the certificate, it should be included with the submission email to ensure accurate processing.

QUICK TIPS

Important

If you cannot retrieve your license in Accela, it likely means that your insurance certificate (or license) has expired in our system.

Contractors are responsible for submitting updated license and insurance information.
