Developed to increase victim support, mitigate trauma, and enhance its response to victims of crime within the city, the Victim Advocacy Unit is committed to serving victims of crime utilizing a client-centered and trauma-informed approach tailored to individualized needs and circumstances.

Advocacy services include but are not limited to providing information on victims' rights, crisis intervention and emotional support, assessment of needs and safety, providing appropriate resources and referrals, and assistance with crime victim compensation applications and filing injunctions for protection.

The Victim Advocate assists victims and families of violent crimes including, but not limited to: Aggravated Assault, Domestic Violence, Homicide, Human Trafficking, Sexual Assault, and Traffic Fatalities.

Desarrollado para aumentar el apoyo a las víctimas, mitigar el trauma de las víctimas y mejorar su respuesta a las víctimas de delitos dentro de la ciudad, el Programa de Defensa de las Víctimas está comprometido a servir a las víctimas de delitos utilizando un enfoque centrado en el cliente y enfoque informado sobre el trauma adaptado a las necesidades y circunstancias individualizadas.

Los servicios de defensa incluyen, entre otros: brindar información sobre los derechos de las víctimas, intervención en crisis y apoyo emocional, evaluación de necesidades y seguridad, proporcionar recursos y referencias apropiadas y asistencia práctica que incluye asistencia con solicitudes y presentación de órdenes judiciales de protección.

El Defensor de Víctimas ayuda a las víctimas y familias de delitos violentos que incluyen, entre otros: agresión agravada, violencia doméstica, homicidio, trata de personas, agresión sexual y muertes por accidentes de tránsito.
