WHEREAS, World Down Syndrome Day, held annually on March 21st has been officially observed by the United Nations since 2012, and it was established to bring awareness globally regarding Down syndrome, what it means to have Down syndrome, and how persons with Down syndrome play a vital role in lives and communities throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, March 21st was chosen as the annual Down Syndrome Awareness Day to signify the uniqueness of the triplication (trisomy) of the 21st chromosome which causes Down syndrome, and on this special day, people with Down syndrome, families, friends and advocates work to bring awareness about the syndrome and to bring attention to others that we are all individuals and deserve to be included, respected and regarded as contributing members of the community; and

WHEREAS, the #LotsOf Socks campaign was created to bring additional awareness to World Down Syndrome Day whereby people all over the world wear socks, some in vivid wild colors and some mismatched, to draw attention to the initiative held each March 21st; and

WHEREAS, GiGi's Playhouse is a network of nonprofit Down Syndrome Achievement Centers with a mission to change the way the world views Down syndrome through community campaigns, educational programs, and by empowering individuals with Down syndrome and their families, and locally, GiGi's Playhouse Tampa, established in 2018, is sustained through community partner support, generous donors and fundraising events, and the organization currently serves over 450 registered families six days a week with one-on-one literacy tutoring, handwriting classes, specialty programs for all ages, and much more.
