WHEREAS, reading increases vocabulary, writing skills, and knowledge and it is important that youth understand current critical issues, events, and what is taking place in their own community, state, nation and around the world; and

WHEREAS, Newspaper in Education (NIE) is an international program promoting literacy by utilizing newspapers as a "living textbook" teaching tool, and newspapers can be used with all classroom subjects as a progressive resource, providing teachers from primary through adult education with contemporary informational text that engage students and relate academic learning to real-world experiences, and students who learn using the newspaper become more engaged citizens as adults, and schools with NIE programs do better in reading scores than those students without access to this valuable tool; and

WHEREAS, an initiative of the American Press Institute, *Newspaper in Education Week*, has been celebrated annually during the first full school week in March, and the program provides newspapers and original award-winning curriculum supplements to classrooms and during times of uncertainty such as the recent pandemic, it is vital that access to quality materials and resources be provided for in-home and in-school learning, and NIE has produced twelve original educational publications, three of which won national awards from the National Newspaper Association; and

WHEREAS, for a half a century, the *Tampa Bay Times Newspaper in Education* program has served educators, students, and families throughout the community by providing classrooms sets of digital and print newspapers, award-winning educational publications, teacher guides, lesson plans, educator workshops and other resources at no cost to the schools, teachers or students, and during 2020-2021, it provided more than 500,000 print copies and 10 million digital editions of the Tampa Bay Times to classrooms across Tampa Bay, serving teachers and schools in Citrus, Hernando, Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco and Pinellas counties.
