WHEREAS, the main cause of lung cancer includes smoking, radon, hazardous chemicals and particle pollution, and many people acquire lung cancer that have never smoked, and since 1904, the American Lung Association has led the fight for healthy lungs and healthy air, and its mission is to save lives by improving lung health and preventing lung disease, and the organization is committed to its goals through advocacy and increased awareness; and

WHEREAS, along with the American Lung Association, many organizations are dedicated to lung cancer advocacy in our community and throughout the nation including the American Lung Cancer Screening Association whose mission is to promote lung cancer screenings for high risk people, Women's Lung Cancer Forum, a community of lung cancer patients, survivors, physicians, researchers, friends and supporters, and Prelude to a Cure Tampa is a local non-profit organization with the motto *The Grand Finale to Lung Cancer*.
