WHEREAS, the Tampa Organization of Black Affairs (TOBA), a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization, was created in 1979 by Robert Morrison, David McQuay, and Delano S. Stewart to address political, educational, social, and economic development concerns in the Tampa, Florida African American community in a meaningful manner, and the vision and mission of inspiring, empowering, and preparing new generations of leaders was set forth; and

WHEREAS, on Monday, January 15, 2024, the Tampa Organization of Black Affairs will host its 44th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Leadership Breakfast held at the JW Marriott Tampa Water Street hotel featuring the theme 60 Years Still Rising Toward the Dream, and the event will foster positive community relations, recognize corporations and individuals for their positive contributions, and features special guest speaker, Dr. Cynthia Butler-McIntyre, who is an education advocate and activist, highly respected for her many outstanding achievements, formerly serving as the 24th national president of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., a Human Resource Director of the Jefferson Parish School System in Harvey, Louisiana where she has impacted the lives of countless youth and employees, and she was appointed by President Barack Obama as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Christopher Columbus Fellowship Foundation and much more.
