NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Buckhorn, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim October 9, 2011 as

"LEIF ERIKSON DAY"

in the City of Tampa, Florida, and urge all citizens to take part in the activities planned in recognition of this great explorer and in honor of the many American-Norwegians who live in our area.
