WHEREAS, established in 1868 by Jane Cunningham Croly and originally named Sorosis, it was renamed General Federation of Women's Clubs in 1890 after sixty-three women's clubs throughout the United States joined together; and

WHEREAS, today the more than 100,000 members of GFWC are represented in all 50 states, including Tampa, Florida, and more than a dozen countries, and is one of the largest and oldest woman's volunteer organizations in the world; and

WHEREAS, the GFWC members are dedicated to enhancing the lives families and communities through the arts, conservation, education, home life, public issues, and international outreach, and has committed their efforts to important causes including the fight against domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, the Southern Region of GFWC will host its Annual Regional Conference in Tampa, Florida at the Mainsail Suites and Conference Center on October 29-30, 2011, and includes members from Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, and South Carolina.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Buckhorn, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim October 29, 2011, as
