WHEREAS, beginning her career with the City of Tampa on February 15, 1968 while still in high school as a member of the Neighborhood Youth Corps and assigned to the Model Cities Program, Sherry became a permanent employee upon graduation from Brandon High School. Her exceptional pride in her work, commitment, attention to detail, and eagerness in learning new and challenging tasks made her a valued clerical assistant in the many departments she was associated with, and was soon promoted to Administrative Assistant to Directors and Division Heads, performing all office management responsibilities, including staff supervision; and

WHEREAS, Sherry's dedication to the City of Tampa and its citizens, her extensive knowledge and abilities were held in the utmost regard, and from 1986 until her retirement in April, 2011 she served in Executive Aide positions, working directly for three mayors, Mayor Sandra Freedman, Mayor Dick Greco, and Mayor Pam Iorio, and was well known for her high ethical standards, professionalism, and loyalty. Sherry was proud to be a public servant and loved assisting the citizens of the community, making sure their concerns were addressed, finding them answers to their questions, and treating each one with respect and personal attention; and

WHEREAS, recognized by all as the consummate wordsmith, Sherry was valued for the proclamations and letters she composed, researching the information and creating beautifully written documents that live on in history, commemorating organizations, businesses, individuals and events, and her abilities are widely recognized, setting the standard for how official documents should be created; and

WHEREAS, in the four decades of service to the City of Tampa, there is not a department that Sherry did not impact, and few employees that did not know and value her genuine kindness and friendliness, enthusiasm, and willingness to go above and beyond to assist others, and the Tampa community is a better place because of the many lives she touched. Sherry's compassionate nature, mentoring, and strength of character have set an example for us all and she will be greatly missed by so many.
