WHEREAS, the AIDS Institute, founded in Tampa, Florida is a national, not-for-profit organization, and its mission is to promote action for social change through public policy research, advocacy, and education, and the Metro Wellness and Community Centers, a comprehensive social service agency that meets the needs of those affected with HIV/AIDS, are hosting the Annual Red Ribbon Run held on December 1, 2011 at Lowry Park Zoo in Tampa, Florida to raise necessary funding and awareness.
