WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Buckhorn, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim January 20, 2012 as

"FLORIDA ARBOR DAY"

in the City of Tampa, Florida, and urge all citizens to join me in supporting efforts to protect our trees and woodland and to support our city's urban forestry programs.
