WHEREAS, scooters and motorcycles also require only a fraction of the parking space needed by larger passenger vehicles, thereby reducing parking congestion in active business districts; and

WHEREAS, commuting to work by scooter or motorcycle provides a means of transportation which could save a person money, lessen the environmental impact, and create more space in our city's more active areas; and

WHEREAS, the City of Tampa is proud to be an environmental steward and is committed to making sustainable choices and managing our resources effectively and efficiently; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the 21st Annual National Ride to Work Day, Blick Law Firm is hosting an open house on Monday, June 18, 2012 and will be offering refreshments, free Driver's License checks and opportunities to win door prizes to all licensed motorists.
