NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Buckhorn, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim August 6th, 2012 as

"JAMAICA FLAG DAY"

in the City of Tampa, Florida and call upon our citizens to join me in acknowledging the journey that Jamaica has made as a country, and celebrate 50 years of its cultural richness and contributions by wearing the Jamaican Flag colors on this auspicious day.
