WHEREAS, these designations remind us to recognize the importance of active, responsible citizenship in preserving our Constitution's blessings and the historic importance of the Constitution's role on our lives today; and

WHEREAS, these commemorations also serve to encourage us to draw strength and guidance from our Constitution in an effort to ensure that the blessings of American liberty endure and extend for generations to come. The City of Tampa is pleased to once again join the local chapter of the American Daughters of the American Revolution in commemorating these events.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Buckhorn, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim

September 17, 2012 as

"CITIZENSHIP DAY"

and

the week of September 17-23, 2012 as

"CONSTITUTION WEEK"

in the City of Tampa, Florida, and urge all citizens to join me in reflecting on the rights and responsibilities of citizenship and the many benefits our Constitution provides us.
