WHEREAS, established in 1913 by twenty-two women on the Howard University Campus in Washington, D.C., the organization remains true to the Founders' vision of promoting academic excellence, providing scholarship assistance, supporting the underserved, educating and stimulating participation in the establishment of positive public policy, and highlighting issues and providing solutions to problems in their communities; and

WHEREAS, with its biennium theme, Uncompromising Commitment to Communities: Service, Leadership, Empowerment Delta Sigma Theta Sorority is faithfully committed to the Five Point Programmatic Thrust of Economic Development, Educational Development, International Awareness and Involvement, Physical and Mental Health, and Political Awareness and Involvement, and the organization's current National President, Dr. Paulette C. Walker calls Tampa, Florida home, and her motto is No one can make you feel inferior without your consent; and

WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Sorority began their commitment to service one-hundred and three years ago with their participation in the 1913 Women's Suffrage March on Washington, D.C., and remain active members in organizations such as the National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC), the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), and National Council of Negro Women (NCNW); and

WHEREAS, the members of the Tampa Alumnae and Tampa Metropolitan Alumnae Chapters of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. are actively involved in the community, providing support and volunteer services to needy families, scholarships to deserving students, advocacy and education, award-winning programs and partnerships, and as part of the national **Delta Days** program, they visit the City of Tampa annually to bring their mission to local government and allow the opportunity for interaction with elected officials to foster knowledge and understanding.
