WHEREAS, the *Childhood Apraxia of Speech Association of North America* (CASANA), whose motto is "Every Child Deserves a Voice," established May 14th as Apraxia Awareness Day to emphasize to industry professionals the need to correctly identify and treat children with Apraxia; and

WHEREAS, Apraxia Kids is a leading nonprofit organization with a mission of supporting parents and professionals in understanding and raising awareness, and envisions a world where every child with CAS reaches their highest level of communication potential through accurate diagnosis and appropriate timely treatment; and

WHEREAS, locally, in recognition of Apraxia Awareness Day, the Florida Apraxia Kids organization is hosting several events throughout the Tampa Bay community during the month of May including an *Apraxia Awareness Family Celebration* at Great Explorations in St. Petersburg, Florida on Saturday, May 25, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jane Castor, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the city of Tampa, Florida, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, May 14, 2019 as
