PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project will improve pedestrian, bicycle, and motor vehicle safety and connectivity in the City's vibrant Downtown River Arts neighborhood. The current intersection at Doyle Carlton Drive and Laurel Street was designed in the 1960s mainly for motor vehicle traffic. This outdated design conflicts with City goals to have complete streets that are safe for all types of users.

The project, which includes a roundabout intersection and other safety, mobility, and aesthetic features, is considered to the best solution for this dynamic Downtown location.

PROJECT FEATURES & BENEFITS TO THE COMMUNITY

- Walking and biking accommodations to support all users and public spaces
- Roundabout intersection to effectively eliminate high-speed crashes
- Efficient use of space provides greater opportunities for landscaping and public art
- Upgraded drainage for safer roadway travel

DARK GRAY features depict travel lanes for vehicles.

GREEN features show the bicycle path through the intersection.

LIGHT GRAY features (with white stripes) shows the raised crosswalks on all legs of the intersection.
