ABOUT THE **HYDE PARK GROUNDWATER DIVERSION PROJECT**

The City of Tampa's Hyde Park Groundwater
Diversion Project is a neighborhood enhancement project located in the Hyde Park Historic District.
The project will provide continued relief to chronic ponding issues on sidewalks and streets associated with groundwater seepage by installing underdrains below the sidewalks to intercept groundwater and divert it to the existing storm sewer system along Bayshore Boulevard. The project will improve sidewalks and road surface conditions for safer walking, biking, and driving.


HYDE PARK GROUNDWATER DIVERSION PROJECT CONSTRUCTION ADVISORY

As part of the City of Tampa's Hyde Park Groundwater Diversion Project, construction will begin on the east side of S. Oregon Ave. north of Watrous Ave. beginning on May 1, 2024. Work will include installation of an underdrain pipe under the sidewalks. The work zone will require blocking a part of the street within the work area for construction access. In an effort to alleviate traffic disruptions, the City will keep at least one lane and one sidewalk open in each block at all times. Where underdrains cross streets, temporary road closures will be necessary, and roads will be reopened to traffic as soon as the crossing is complete. The standard working hours are Monday through Friday, from 7 am to 7 pm and Saturday, from 8 am to 5 pm.
