



Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964



No person shall, on the basis of his or her race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance pursuant to the requirements of Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act.

The Mayor and City Council value diversity and welcomes input from all interested parties. Moreover, the City does not tolerate discrimination in any of its federally assisted programs, services or activities. The City of Tampa will not exclude participation in, deny the benefits of, or subject to discrimination anyone on the grounds of race, color, and national origin.

File a Complaint

Any person who believes that he or she has been subjected to discrimination based upon race, color, and national origin, may file a complaint with the City's Title VI Officer:

Streetside 15' 2-Parking Lanes 2-Lanes 1-Turn Lane Streetside 15'





















Bollard – (Tournesol) Fairweather 'B-3' (6") black removable bollard














Traffic Flow – Morning Peak Hour








Traffic Flow – Afternoon Peak Hour







Options Summary and Construction Costs



Concept Item	Wide Streetside Option	Cycle Track Option
Streetsides	Widen 15' to 21'.	Remain same width.
Parking Lanes	Same as existing, except, one parking lane remove from Jefferson to Nebraska Avenue.	
Vehicular Lanes	Dedicated turn lanes removed. Lane configuration from Jefferson to Nebraska Avenue remains as existing.	
Cyclist Facilities	Cyclist may share the road at low traffic segments, or ride along the streetside.	Two-way bicycle facility separated from traffic through a raised separator.
Streetscape and Stormwater	Wide streetsides provide room for enhanced improvements.	Maximize space within existing streetsides.
Construction Cost	Estimated \$6.3 Million.	Estimated \$6.3 Million.
