### RESOLUTION NO. 2025 - <u>90</u>

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT FOR CONSULTANT SERVICES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$128,481.08 BETWEEN THE CITY OF TAMPA AND CPH CONSULTING, LLC IN CONNECTION WITH CONTRACT 24-D-00027 LAKESHORE PUMP STATION FORCE MAIN REPLACEMENT DESIGN; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF TAMPA TO EXECUTE SAME; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, via the competitive selection process in accordance with Florida Statutes Section 287.055, Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act ("CCNA"), as applicable, the City of Tampa ("City") selected CPH Consulting, LLC ("Firm") to provide professional services in connection with 24-D-00027 Lakeshore Pump Station Force Main Replacement Design ("Project") as detailed in the Agreement for Consultant Services ("Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into this Agreement with the Firm to provide design and replacement of the Lakeshore Pump Station Force Main. The existing pipeline is deteriorated and in danger of failing. Failure of the pipeline could result in a wastewater overflow that may impact the surrounding environment or cause a public health risk; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Tampa to enter into this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF TAMPA, FLORIDA, THAT:

- **Section 1**. The Agreement between the City and the Firm, in connection with Contract 24-D-00027 Lakeshore Pump Station Force Main Replacement Design, copies of which are attached hereto and made a part hereof, are authorized and approved in their entirety or in substantially similar form.
- **Section 2.** The Mayor of the City of Tampa is authorized and empowered to execute, and the City Clerk of the City of Tampa ("City Clerk") to attest and affix the official seal of the City of Tampa to, said Agreement on behalf of the City of Tampa.
- **Section 3.** This resolution provides funding in the amount of \$128,481.08 for Lakeshore Pump Station Force Main Replacement Design Project use by the Wastewater Department within the Wastewater Capital Construction Fund.
- **Section 4.** The City Clerk shall file a fully executed copy of each Agreement in the official records of the City of Tampa as maintained by the Office of the City Clerk.

### AGREEMENT FOR CONSULTANT SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") made and entered into a	t Tampa, Florida, as of the day of
, 2025, which is the date Resolution No	was adopted authorizing execution of
this Agreement, by and between the CITY OF TAMPA, a municipal of	corporation of the State of Florida,
("CITY"), the address of which is 315 East Kennedy Boulevard, Tam	pa, Florida 33602, and CPH Consulting,
LLC, a Florida corporation authorized to do business in the State of	Florida, ("FIRM"), the address of which is
1117 E. Robinson St., Orlando, Florida 32801.	

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to engage the FIRM to perform certain professional services pertinent to such work which shall be referred to as Contract 24-D-00027 Lakeshore Pump Station Force Main Replacement Design ("PROJECT") in accordance with this Agreement; and

**WHEREAS,** the FIRM desires to provide such professional services in accordance with this Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the mutual covenants, promises, representations and considerations to be kept, performed and paid, the parties hereto agree for themselves, their successors and assigns, as follows:

### I. GENERAL SCOPE OF THIS AGREEMENT

- A. The relationship of the FIRM to the CITY will be that of an independent professional consultant for the PROJECT; and the FIRM shall provide the professional and technical services required under this Agreement in accordance with the care and skill used by members of FIRM'S profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality ("Standard of Care").
  - B. The scope of services to be provided is indicated in **Exhibit A** ("Services").

### II. DATA AND SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CITY

The CITY shall provide available plans and specifications of existing construction, if any, applicable to the Project.

### III. PERIOD OF SERVICE

- A. The FIRM shall begin work promptly after receipt of a fully executed copy of this Agreement and a Notice to Proceed. This Agreement shall remain in force until the completion of all construction for the Project.
- B. The FIRM's services called for under this Agreement shall be completed provided that, if the FIRM's services are delayed for reasons beyond the FIRM's control, the time of performance shall be adjusted appropriately.

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### IV. GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

- A. All original sketches, tracings, drawings, computations, details, design calculations, specifications and other documents and plans that result from the FIRM's services under this Agreement shall become and remain the property of the CITY upon receipt of payment by the FIRM from the CITY for services rendered in connection with the preparation of said sketches, tracings, etc. Where such documents are required to be filed with governmental agencies, the FIRM will furnish copies to the CITY upon request.
- B. The CITY acknowledges that the materials cited in Paragraph IV. A. above, which are provided by the FIRM, are not intended for use in connection with any project or purpose other than the project and purpose for which such materials were prepared without prior written consent and adaptation by the FIRM shall be at the CITY's sole risk, and the FIRM shall have no responsibility or liability therefor.
- C. Any use by the CITY of such materials in connection with a project or purpose other than that for which such materials are prepared without prior written consent and adaptation by the FIRM shall be at the CITY's sole risk, and the FIRM shall have no responsibility or liability therefore.

### V. COMPENSATION

The CITY shall compensate the FIRM for the services performed with this Agreement a lump sum (by task) of \$128,481.08 to be billed in accordance with **Exhibit B**.

### VI. PAYMENT

Payments shall be made upon presentation of the FIRM's approved invoice.

### VII. RECORDS

Records for Personnel Expenses shall be kept on a generally recognized accounting basis and shall be available to the CITY or its authorized representative at mutually convenient times.

With respect to all matters covered by this Agreement, records will be made available for examination, audit, inspection, or copying purposes upon prior written notice at any time during normal business hours at a location within Hillsborough County, Florida as often as the CITY, HUD (if applicable), representatives of the Comptroller General of the United States or other federal agency may reasonably require. FIRM will permit same to be examined and excerpts or transcriptions made or duplicated from such records, and audits made of all contracts, invoices, materials, records of personnel and of employment and other data relating to all matters covered by this Agreement. The CITY's right of inspection and audit shall obtain likewise with reference to any audits made by any other agency, whether local, state or federal. FIRM shall retain all records and supporting documentation applicable to this Agreement for five (5) years from the date of submission of the annual performance report to HUD, if applicable. If any litigation, claim, negotiation, audit, monitoring, inspection or other action has been started before the expiration of the required record retention period, records must be retained until completion of the action and resolution of all issues which arise from it, or the end of the required period, whichever is later.

### VIII. PERSONNEL

The FIRM represents that it has or will secure, at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this Agreement. All personnel engaged in the work shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under State and local law to perform such services. No person who is serving sentence in a penal or correctional institution shall be employed for work under this Agreement. The FIRM further certifies that all of its employees assigned to serve the CITY have such knowledge and experience as required to perform the duties assigned to them. Any employee of the FIRM who, in the opinion of the CITY, is incompetent, or whose conduct becomes detrimental to the work, shall immediately be removed from association with the certain professional engineering services under this Agreement.

### IX. SUSPENSION, CANCELLATION OR ABANDONMENT

In the event the PROJECT is suspended, cancelled or abandoned, the FIRM shall be given fifteen (15) days prior written notice of such action and shall be compensated for the professional services provided and reimbursable expenses incurred up to the date of suspension, cancellation or abandonment in an amount mutually agreed to by the CITY and FIRM and supported by back-up documentation.

Upon suspension, cancellation or abandonment hereof, FIRM shall immediately cease work hereunder and shall be compensated for its services rendered up to the time of such cancellation or termination on a quantum meruit basis; and the CITY shall have no further financial obligation to FIRM.

In the event the PROJECT is suspended, cancelled or abandoned, the FIRM shall deliver all original sketches, tracings, drawings, computations, details, design calculations, specifications and other documents and plans that result from the FIRM's services under this Agreement. The aforementioned original sketches, tracings, drawings, computations, details, design calculations, specifications and other documents and plans shall be without restriction on future use by the CITY except that FIRM shall not be liable for such future use by the CITY.

### X. TERMINATION

A. <u>Termination for Cause</u>. In the event that the FIRM shall for any reason or through any cause not have completed performance within the time fixed for performance under this Agreement; or any representation or warranty made under Article XII of this Agreement shall prove to be untrue in any material respect; or the FIRM shall otherwise be in default under this Agreement; or the FIRM has subcontracted, assigned, delegated, transferred its rights, obligations or interests under this Agreement without the CITY's consent or approval; or the FIRM has filed bankruptcy, become insolvent or made an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or a receiver, or similar officer has been appointed to take charge of all or part of FIRM assets; or the FIRM disclosed CITY confidential information, procedures or activities; or the FIRM fails to aggressively, adequately, timely and appropriately perform the services required by this Agreement to the satisfaction of the CITY, or other similar cause, the City may terminate this Agreement for cause.

Then the CITY may provide five (5) days written notice that the conduct of the FIRM is such that the interests of the CITY are likely to be impaired or prejudiced, stating the facts upon which the opinion is based. Then the CITY may upon fifteen (15) days written notice, and at the end of the (15) days terminate

this Agreement for cause (herein "Termination Date"). Upon that termination for cause, the FIRM shall be entitled to compensation for services properly and satisfactorily performed through the date of such termination for cause. In the event of such termination for cause, the FIRM shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work performed as of the Termination Date; however, FIRM shall not be compensated for any anticipatory profits that have not been earned as of the date of the Termination Date. All work accomplished by FIRM prior to the Termination Date shall be documented. In the event the project is terminated for cause pursuant to this Article, the FIRM shall deliver all original sketches, tracings, drawings, computations, details, design calculations, specifications and other documents and plans that result from the FIRM's services under this Agreement. The aforementioned original sketches, tracings, drawings, computations, details, design calculations, specifications and other documents and plans shall be without restriction on future use by the CITY. Notwithstanding the above or any section herein to the contrary, FIRM shall not be relieved of liability to the CITY for damages sustained by the CITY by virtue of any breach of the Contract by FIRM.

B. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>. The CITY may reduce the scope of work or terminate work under this Agreement or amendment to this Agreement without cause; in the event of such scope reduction or termination other than for cause, the CITY shall compensate the FIRM for services properly performed through the date of such reduction in scope or termination, which date shall be fixed in written notice from the CITY and which date shall be not sooner than fifteen (15) days after notice. Notwithstanding such termination or reduction in scope, the CITY shall be entitled to receive from the FIRM upon request any and all information related to the PROJECT and the CITY shall preserve and protect all such information and assure ready access thereto by the FIRM in connection with resolution of the amount due to the FIRM. The CITY, at its own discretion, shall be entitled to direct the FIRM to terminate any or all the FIRM's subcontracts or subconsulting agreements. In the event the project is terminated for convenience pursuant to this Article, the FIRM shall deliver all original sketches, tracings, drawings, computations, details, design calculations, specifications and other documents and plans that result from the FIRM's services under this Agreement. The aforementioned original sketches, tracings, drawings, computations, details, design calculations, specifications and other documents and plans shall be without restriction on future use by the CITY.

### XI. INSURANCE

The FIRM, at its own cost and expense, shall effect and maintain at all times during the life of this Agreement insurance, in accordance with that indicated in **Exhibit C**.

### XII. INTERESTS OF MEMBERS OF THE CITY

No member of the governing body of the CITY and no other officer, employee, or agent of the CITY who exercise any functions or responsibilities in connection with the carrying out of the PROJECT to which this Agreement pertains shall have any personal interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement.

### XIII. INTEREST OF THE FIRM

The FIRM covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, in any project to which this Agreement pertains or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with its performance of any contracted service hereunder. The FIRM further covenants that in the performance of this Agreement no person having such interest shall be employed.

The FIRM warrants that he or she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the FIRM to solicit or secure this Agreement and that he or she has not paid or agreed to pay any person, company, corporation, individual, or firm, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the FIRM any fee, commission, percentage, gift, or other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Agreement.

The FIRM shall disclose any clients that may either conflict with or affect its independent judgment when performing any work for the City of Tampa covered by this Agreement. Failure of the FIRM to disclose the above professional conflict of interest may result in termination of this Agreement pursuant to Article X of this Agreement and may require the return of all payments, if any, made to the FIRM from the City. If, in its sole discretion the CITY of Tampa determines that a professional conflict of interest is deemed to exist, the FIRM shall be disqualified from participating in the proposed Project.

### XIV. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

- A. The FIRM shall comply with the applicable requirements of State laws and all Codes and Ordinances of the City of Tampa as amended from time to time, together with keeping and maintaining in full force and effect during the term of this Agreement all licenses and certificates of authorization required pursuant to applicable law, including without limitation those required by Chapters 471, 481, and 489, Florida Statutes.
- B. If the PROJECT involves E.P.A. Grant eligible work, the CITY and the FIRM agree that the provisions of 40 CFR, Part 35, Appendix C-1, shall become a part of this Agreement and that such provisions shall supersede any conflicting provisions of this Agreement for work performed under said Agreement.
- C. If the PROJECT involves work under other Federal or State Grantors or Approving Agencies, the CITY and the FIRM shall review and approve the applicable required provisions or any other supplemental provisions as may be included in the Agreement.
- D. Truth-In-Negotiation Certification: The FIRM certifies that the wage rates and other factual unit costs supporting the compensation are accurate, complete, and current at the time of the execution of the Agreement of which this Certificate is a part. The original price and any additions thereto shall be adjusted to exclude any significant sums by which the City determines the Agreement amount was increased due to inaccurate, incomplete, or non-current wage rates and other factual unit costs and that such original Agreement adjustments shall be made within one (1) year following the end of the Agreement.
- E. Any documents provided by FIRM to the CITY are public records and the CITY may authorize third parties to review and reproduce such documents pursuant to public records laws, including the provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes

### XV. **ASSIGNABILITY**

Neither party shall assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement without consent from the other party; provided, however, that the claim for money due or to become due the FIRM from the CITY under this Agreement may be assigned to a bank or other financial institution or to a Trustee in Bankruptcy. Notice of any such assignment shall be furnished promptly to the CITY.

### XVI. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT

During the performance of this Agreement or any related Work Order, the FIRM shall:

- A. Not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, age, sex, handicap, or national origin. FIRM shall take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, handicap, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. FIRM shall post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- B. In all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the FIRM, it must state that all qualified applicants will receive considerations for employment without regard to race, color, religion, age, sex, handicap, or national origin.

### XVII. EQUAL BUSINESS OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM

- A. FIRM shall demonstrate good faith effort toward the utilization of City certified Women/Minority Business Enterprise (W/MBE) and Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE) subconsultants or suppliers.
  - B. The CITY shall make available a list of Certified W/MBEs and SLBEs.
- C. The FIRM shall report to the CITY its subcontractors/subconsultants/suppliers solicited or utilized (Exhibit D).
- D. At the time of the submission of invoices, the FIRM shall submit to the CITY a report (Exhibit D) of all subcontractors, subconsultants or suppliers utilized with their final contract amounts and any other reports or forms as may be required by the CITY.

### XVIII. <u>CITY CODE OF ETHICS</u>

In connection with this Agreement, the FIRM hereby covenants and agrees that it shall comply with all applicable governmental laws, statutes, rules and regulations including, without limitation, the City of Tampa's Code of Ethics. Pursuant to Section 2-522 of the City of Tampa Code, the FIRM acknowledges that if it fails to comply with the City of Tampa's Code of Ethics, such a failure shall render this Agreement voidable by the CITY and subject the FIRM to debarment from any future CITY contracts or agreements.

### XIX. <u>NEGATION OF AGENT OR EMPLOYEE STATUS</u>

FIRM shall perform this Agreement as an independent consultant and nothing contained herein shall in any way be construed to constitute FIRM or the assistants of FIRM to be representative, agent, subagent, or employee of CITY or any political subdivision of the State of Florida. FIRM certifies FIRM's understanding that CITY is not required to withhold any federal income tax, social security tax, state

and local tax, to secure worker's compensation insurance or employer's liability insurance of any kind or to take any other action with respect to the insurance or taxes of FIRM and assistants of FIRM.

In no event and under no circumstances shall any provision of this Agreement make CITY or any political subdivision of the State of Florida liable to any person or entity that contracts with or that provides goods or services to FIRM in connection with the Services the FIRM has agreed to perform hereunder or otherwise, or for any debts or claims of any nature accruing to any person or entity against FIRM; and there is no contractual relationship, either express or implied, between CITY or any political subdivision of the State of Florida any person or entity supplying any work, labor, services, goods or materials to FIRM as a result of the provisions of the Services provided by FIRM hereunder or otherwise.

### XX. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>

If any item or provision to this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Agreement shall not be affected and every other term and provision of this Agreement shall be deemed valid and enforceable to the extent permitted by law.

### XXI. CHOICE OF LAW

The laws of the State of Florida (without giving effect to its conflicts of law principles) govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including, without limitation, its interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement.

### XXII. DESIGNATION OF FORUM

Any party bringing a legal action or proceeding against any other party arising out of or relating to this Agreement may bring the legal action or proceeding in the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida, Tampa Division or in any court of the State of Florida sitting in Tampa.

### XXIII. <u>AUTHORIZATION</u>

Each party represents to the other that such has authority under all applicable laws to enter into an agreement containing each covenants and provisions as are contained herein, that all of the procedural requirements imposed by law upon each party for the approval and authorization of this Agreement have been properly completed, and that the persons who have executed the Agreement on behalf of each party are authorized and empowered to execute said Agreement.

### XIV. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between the parties and there are no promises or understandings other than those stated herein. Exhibits to this Agreement shall be deemed to be incorporated by reference as though set forth in full herein. In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between this Agreement and the provisions in the incorporated Exhibits, and unless otherwise specified herein, then this Agreement will prevail.

### XXV. INDEMNIFICATION

The FIRM shall indemnify and hold harmless the CITY, and its officers and employees, from liabilities, damages, losses, and costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees, to the extent caused by the negligence, recklessness, or intentionally wrongful conduct of the FIRM and other persons employed or utilized by the FIRM in the performance of the Agreement.

### XXVI. <u>ESTOPPEL/WAIVER</u>

No waiver of any provisions of this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing, signed by the party against whom it is asserted and any such waiver shall only be applicable to the specific instance in which it relates and shall not be deemed to be a continuing waiver.

The failure of the CITY to enforce any term or condition of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver or estoppel of any subsequent violation of this Agreement.

### XXVII. AUDIT REQUIREMENTS.

In the event, that during the period of this Agreement, the Firm expends more than \$1,000,000 in federal funds in an operating year from this and other federal grants, the Firm shall, at its own cost and expense, cause to be carried out an independent audit. The audit shall be completed and a copy furnished to the City, within the earlier of thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of the auditor's report(s) or nine (9) months after the end of the audit period, unless a longer period is agreed to in advance by the City. For purposes of this Agreement, an operating and/or audit year is the equivalent to the Firm's fiscal year. The determination of when Grant Funds are expended is based on when the activity related to the expenditure occurs.

The audit shall be conducted in compliance with the Office of Management and Budget: Part 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, as applicable, which are made a part of this Agreement by reference thereto. In the event the audit shows that the entire funds disbursed hereunder, or any portion thereof, were not expended in accordance with the conditions of this Agreement, the Firm shall be held liable for reimbursement to the City of all funds not expended in accordance with these applicable regulations and Agreement provisions within thirty (30) calendar days after the City has notified the Firm of such non-compliance. Said reimbursement shall not preclude the City from taking any other action as provided herein.

If expenditure does not exceed \$1,000,000 during an operating year, the Firm shall provide the City with its annual financial statement within ninety (90) days of the end of its operating year. Said financial statement shall be prepared by an actively licensed certified public accountant.

State Single Audit: Each non-state entity shall comply with all applicable requirements of section 215.97, F.S., and Audit Requirements. A State single audit is required if an nonstate entity expends \$1,000,000 or more of State financial assistance in any fiscal year of such non-state entity in accordance with the requirements of the Florida Single Audit Act.

### XXVIII. DEFAULT

A default shall consist of any use of Grant Funds for a purpose other than as authorized by this Agreement, noncompliance with any provision in all Articles herein, any material breach of the Agreement, failure to comply with the audit requirements as provided herein, or failure to expend Grant Funds in a timely or proper manner. A cancellation for default pursuant to this Article shall not impair or limit the City's remedy for the Firm's breach of warranty to the extent of work performed, not for errors or omissions in the professional engineering services prior to cancellation.

### XXIX. BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS

The City is subject to Section 166.241, Florida Statutes, and is not authorized to contract for expenditures in any fiscal year except in pursuance of budgeted appropriates. With respect to this Agreement, the City has budgeted and appropriated sufficient monies to fund the City's obligations under this Agreement. The obligations of the City hereunder shall not constitute a general indebtedness of the City within the meaning of the Florida Constitution.

### XXX. SCRUTINIZED COMPANIES

Section 287.135, Florida Statutes, prohibits agencies or local governmental entities from contracting with companies for (i) goods or services of any amount on either the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List, created pursuant to Section 215.4725, Florida Statutes, or is engaged in a boycott of Israel and (ii) goods or services of \$1,000,000 or more that are on either the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List, created pursuant to Section 215.473, Florida Statutes, or is engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria. A company that is on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List or is engaged in a boycott of Israel or is engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria is ineligible to, and may not, bid on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract with an agency or local governmental entity for goods or services of any amount. A company that is on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List or is engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria or is on the Iran Terrorism Sector List is ineligible to, and may not, bid on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract with an agency or local governmental entity for goods or services of \$1,000,000 or more. FIRM certifies that it is not in violation of Section 287.135, Florida Statutes. If the City determines the FIRM submitted a false certification, or has been placed on the Scrutinized Companies Activities in the Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List, or is on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List or is engaged in a boycott of Israel or been engaged in business operations in Cuba or Syria, the City shall have the option to terminate this Agreement or maintain it subject to the conditions of Section 287.135 of the Florida Statutes.

### XXXI. PUBLIC RECORDS

- A. <u>Exempt Plans</u>. FIRM pursuant to this Agreement (and as part of the solicitation process that resulted in award of this Agreement) may hold, come into possession of, and/or generate certain building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, including draft, preliminary, and final formats, which depict the internal layout and structural elements of a building, facility, or other structure owned or operated by the City or an agency (singularly or collectively "Exempt Plans"), which pursuant to Section 119.071(3), Florida Statutes, are exempt from Section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes and Section 24(a), Art. I of the Florida State Constitution. FIRM certifies it has read and is familiar the exemptions and obligations of Section 119.071(3), Florida Statutes; further that FIRM is and shall remain in compliance with same, including without limitation maintaining the exempt status of such Exempt Plans, for so long as any Exempt Plans are held by or otherwise in its possession. This section shall survive the expiration of earlier termination of this Agreement.
  - B. <u>Data Collection</u>. Pursuant to Section 119.071(5)(a)2a, Florida Statutes, social security

numbers shall only be collected from FIRM by the CITY should such number be needed for identification, verification, and/or tax reporting purposes. To the extent FIRM collects an individual's social security number in the course of acting on behalf of the CITY pursuant to the terms and conditions this Agreement, FIRM shall follow the requirements of Florida's Public Records Law.

- C. <u>Access</u>. The City of Tampa is a public agency subject to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. In accordance with Florida Statutes, 119.0701, FIRM agrees to comply with Florida's Public Records Law, including the following:
- 1. FIRM shall keep and maintain public records required by the CITY to perform the services under this Agreement;
- 2. Upon request by the CITY, provide the CITY with copies of the requested records, having redacted records in total on in part that are exempt from disclosure by law or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time (with provision of a copy of such records to the CITY) on the same terms and conditions that the CITY would provide the records and at a cost that does not exceed that provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, or as otherwise provided by law;
- 3. Ensure that records, in part or in total, that are exempt or that are confidential and exempt from disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement term and following completion (or earlier termination) of the Agreement if FIRM does not transfer the records to the CITY;
- 4. Upon completion (or earlier termination) of the Agreement, FIRM shall within 30 days after such event either transfer to the CITY, at no cost, all public records in possession of the FIRM or keep and maintain the public records in compliance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. If FIRM transfers all public records to the CITY upon completion (or earlier termination) of the Agreement, FIRM shall destroy any duplicate records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If FIRM keeps and maintains public records upon completion (or earlier termination) of the Agreement, FIRM shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the CITY in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the agency.

The failure of FIRM to comply with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, and/or the provisions set forth in this Article shall be grounds for immediate unilateral termination of the Agreement by the CITY; the CITY shall also have the option to withhold compensation due FIRM until records are received as provided herein.

### XXXII. E-VERIFY

Pursuant to §448.095, Florida Statutes, Firm certifies that it is registered with and uses the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the US employment eligibility of all of Firm's employees

hired by the Firm during the term of this Agreement and/or while performing work or providing services for the City of Tampa. Firm shall require that all subcontractors performing work or providing services on behalf of Firm for the City of Tampa also comply with the requirements of §448.095, Fla. Stat and utilize the E-Verify system to verify US employment eligibility of all employees hired by subcontractor. # Lakeshore Pump Station Force Main Replacement Design – Route Analysis 24-D-00027

### **Project Background**

The City of Tampa's Lakeshore Pump Station Force Main was placed into service in 1965. The primarily cast iron pipe (CIP) force main conveys wastewater from the Lakeshore Pump Station, located at 7008 N Lakeshore Dr., to a receiving manhole located at the intersection of N 42<sup>nd</sup> street and Fern Street. The force main is approximately 4,000 linear feet and includes a subaqueous crossing of the Hillsborough River. Due to the force main's age and subsequent deterioration the City has determined complete replacement is required.

During the preliminary scoping meeting the City and CPH design team determined the project should be divided into two phases. Phase 1 (Preliminary Design) would be an initial routing alternatives analysis culminating in a Route Alternatives Analysis Report to document the best route for the force main. Phase 2 would include the complete design of the selected alternative, permitting, easement acquisition if required, construction administration services, and project closeout. Phase 2 services will be submitted as a future scope of services for the City's consideration.

Through an initial review of available project information CPH has identified three potential routes for evaluation:

- A. Route 1 begins at the Lakeshore Pump Station, runs south then continues east within the Lakeshore Dr. right-of-way (ROW) and crosses N 40<sup>th</sup> St. to City owned property on the east side of N 40<sup>th</sup> St. From City property a directional drill is utilized to cross the Hillsborough River generally following N 40<sup>th</sup> St. alignment to another City owned parcel to the north of E Fern St. The main will continue south along N 40<sup>th</sup> St. ROW until turning east on E Fern St. and terminate at the receiving manhole at the intersection of N 42<sup>nd</sup> St. and Fern.
- B. Route 2 begins at the Lakeshore Pump station, runs south then turns east onto E Norfolk St., stays within Norfolk ROW until crossing N 40<sup>th</sup> St., and enters City property on the east side of N 40<sup>th</sup> St. From City property a directional drill is utilized to cross the Hillsborough River in the southeast direction following the existing force main route. The route will then follow existing easements through the River Oaks apartment complex until E Diana St. where it will enter N 42st ROW and terminate at the receiving manhole at the intersection of E Fern St.
- C. Route 3 follows a similar alignment as Route 1 but the crossing of the Hillsborough River will be to the west of N 40<sup>th</sup> St. The proposed directional drill will be shorter in length starting on the perimeter of a stormwater pond at the intersection of Lakeshore Dr. and N 40<sup>th</sup> St. and ending at the perimeter of a stormwater pond on the south side of the river to the west of E Pocahontas Ave. This route may also consider following E Diana St. to N 42<sup>nd</sup> St. to the discharge manhole.




Figure 1 Route Alternatives





### **Scope of Services**

### Task 1 Data Gathering:

- 1.1 Kickoff Meeting: CPH will coordinate and attend a kick-off meeting with City staff to discuss the proposed routes and installation methods. Meeting minutes will be created and provided to the City's Project Manager. The City will provide all available data including as-builts, sewer and drainage maps, known easement and right-of-way-data, and boundary maps.
- **1.2 Site visits:** A total of two site visits are expected. One to walk the proposed route alternatives to identify opportunities or challenges not identifiable in a desktop evaluation and a second to coordinate the boring locations with the Geotechnical subconsultant.
- 1.3 **Property Review and Easement Research:** CPH will review available plat information to determine if there are any existing easements along the proposed route corridors that may be utilized for pipeline construction. A summary and figure of the information will be provided to the City and incorporated into the Route Alternatives Analysis Report.
- **1.4 Existing Utilities Research:** CPH will submit Sunshine 811 Tickets for the proposed route corridors to identify utility providers and send letters to all identified utility providers requesting utility location information. This information will be summarized and incorporated into the Route Analysis Report.
- **1.5** Limited Geotechnical Investigation and Review: CPH shall retain the services of Tierra, Inc. to perform limited geotechnical borings to support the Route Analysis. Geotechnical investigation services include:
  - **1.5.1** Conduct a visual site reconnaissance of the project site and locate and coordinate utility clearance.
  - 1.5.2 Perform two (2) Standard Penetration Test (SPT) borings to depths 80 feet below existing grades at the approximate requested locations along the proposed force main alignment. The borings will be performed in accordance with ASTM D-1586. In each boring, samples will be collected and SPT N-values measured every two feet to a depth of 10 feet and then at 5-foot intervals thereafter. Rock coring will be performed at selected intervals when Limestone is encountered. The rock coring will be performed in 5-ft lengths. Provide percent recovery and Rock Quality Designation for each core run.
  - 1.5.3 Identify groundwater levels at the boring locations.
  - 1.5.4 Visually classify and stratify all recovered soil samples in the laboratory using the Unified Soil Classification System (USCS) in general accordance with the American Society of Testing and Materials (ASTM) test designation D-2488. Perform the following analyses/tests on selected soil samples obtained from the borings:
    - a. Grain size analyses. (ASTM D-6913/AASHTO T-088)
    - Atterberg limits testing. (ASTM D-4318/AASHTO T-089 and T-090)
    - c. Moisture content (ASTM D-2216/AASHTO T-265)
    - d. Unconfined Compression Strength (ASTM D-2938)
    - e. Splitting Tensile Strength (ASTM D-3967)



- **1.5.5** Identify artesian conditions, if encountered.
- **1.5.6** Provide geotechnical design parameters including soil unit weights, friction angles and cohesion for the soil strata encountered in the borings.
- 1.5.7 Prepare a formal engineering report which summarizes the course of study pursued, the field and laboratory data generated, the subsurface conditions encountered and our geotechnical recommendations and construction considerations.

Time is included for CPH to coordinate the location of borings, review the final report, and summarize the results in the Route Alternatives Analysis Report.

1.6 Public Information/Stakeholder Engagement Approach: CPH shall retain the services of Valerin Group to provide public outreach and engagement planning services. Services include assistance in identifying key community stakeholders and any public concerns that may impact final route selection. CPH has included time to review information generated by Subconsultants, provide comments, and incorporate the recommendations into the route analysis.

### Task 2 Environmental Services:

- **2.1 Preliminary Ecological Assessment-** CPH shall perform a preliminary ecological assessment for three (3) force main alignments. Tasks to be completed include the following:
  - 2.1.1 Public Data Base Research: CPH will review Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FFWCC) and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) web-based files and distribution mappings and review the Atlas of Breeding Sites of Herons and Their Allies (FFWCC) to identify recorded listed species within the project site or within the vicinity of the subject property.
  - 2.1.2 Field Investigation: CPH will conduct a preliminary survey by general reconnaissance of the site for the occurrence or potential occurrence of protected species (threatened and endangered) and wetlands and surface waters. The approximate location of all observed protected species and approximate extent and configuration of wetlands and surface waters shall be identified on the FLUCFCS map or aerial photograph prints. Those species referred to as protected are listed under Florida Administrative Code 68A and Florida Statue 581.185 and Code of Federal Regulation (50 CFR 17.11 and 17.12).
  - 2.1.3 Vegetation and Land Use: CPH will prepare a Vegetation and Land Use Map covering the project site. The mapping will follow Level III nomenclature of the Florida Land Use Cover and Forms Classification System (FLUCFCS). The approximate acreage of each classification will be tabulated for the site. The map will be digitized based on "desktop" interpretation of features evident on the aerial photography, correlation with soil types and field verification for each mapped classification. The dominant vegetation of each classification will be recorded.
  - 2.1.4 Report: CPH shall prepare a memorandum report summarizing the habitat and land use mapping, observed protected species, current regulatory considerations, estimated wetland mitigation costs and results of the public data



base search to assist with project planning as applicable to the site conditions. The Client shall receive an electronic copy of the report and figures.

- **2.2 Wetland Delineation-** CPH scientists shall conduct a field investigation of the two (2) project alignments to determine if wetland areas are located within the project corridor:
  - 2.2.1 CPH shall delineate wetlands in the field with flagging tape and/or stakes in accordance with methodologies outlined in Chapter 62-340, F.A.C., and the Corps Wetland Delineation Manual (1987) and the 2008 Corps Interim Regional Supplement to the Corps Wetland Delineation Manual: Atlantic & Gulf Coastal Plain Region.
  - **2.2.2** CPH shall provide a hand drawn sketch on an aerial of the approximate wetland line limits to communicate the flag location and numbers to the surveyor.
  - 2.2.3 CPH shall review the survey and provide QAQC comments to surveyor if edits are needed.
  - **2.2.4** CPH shall document the wetland characteristics on wetland data forms during the wetland delineation.

### Task 3 Route Evaluation:

- 3.1 Route Alternative Evaluation and Selection: CPH shall review all available information provided as a result of Tasks 1 and 2. This information will be used to evaluate the three subject route alternatives and prepare a Preliminary Route Analysis Report. Evaluation criteria includes but is not limited to available work areas, impacts to the local community, environmental impacts, permitting challenges, constructability, existing utilities/subsurface obstructions, ease of future maintenance, easement availability, and cost. The CPH team will meet with the City to review the findings, present a recommended route, and confirm the preferred route selection.
  - 3.1.1 HDD Engineering Services: CPH shall retain the services of Brierley Associates to provide services to review geotechnical information, horizontal directional drill (HDD) path feasibility, pipe material selection, and risk assessments for the crossing of the Hillsborough River via HDD. CPH has included time to coordinate with subconsultants, review the subconsultant design, incorporate subconsultant's technical memorandum into the Route Analysis, and provide comments and feedback as necessary.
- 3.2 Route Alternative Analysis Report Finalization: CPH shall update the Route Analysis Report based on comments from the City and confirmation of the preferred route alternative. A draft final report will be submitted for a final comment period. CPH shall update the report incorporating feedback and submit a final report to the City. CPH will then prepare a scope for final design services based on the Route Analysis Report findings and recommendations.

### Task 4 Project Administration:

**4.1 Project Management**: CPH has included hours for general contract administration and coordination, as well as coordination and review of subconsultant invoices and project tracking.



### Compensation

The total lump sum fee for the Scope of Services described herein is \$128,481. The breakdown of the estimated hours, compensation, and CPH's standards rates are further defined in Exhibit B.

### **EXHIBIT C**

### CITY OF TAMPA INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Prior to commencing any work or services or taking occupancy under that certain written agreement or award (for purposes of this document, Agreement) between the City of Tampa, Florida (City) and Firm/Awardee/Contractor/Consultant/Lessee/non-City party, etc. (for purposes of this document, Firm) to which this document is attached and incorporated as an Exhibit or otherwise, and continuing during the term of said Agreement (or longer if the Agreement and/or this document so requires), Firm shall provide, pay for, and maintain insurance against claims for injuries to persons (including death) or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the Agreement (including without limitation occupancy and/or use of certain property/premises) by Firm, its agents, representatives, employees, suppliers, subtenants, or subcontractors (which term includes subconsultants, as applicable) of any tier subject to the terms and conditions of this document. Firm's maintenance of insurance coverage as required herein is a material element of the Agreement and the failure to maintain or renew coverage or provide evidence of same (defined to include without limitation Firm's affirmative duty to provide from time to time upon City's request certificates of insurance, complete and certified copies of Firm's insurance policies, forms, and endorsements, information on the amount of claims payments or reserves chargeable to the aggregate amount of coverage(s) whether during the term of the Agreement or after as may be requested by the City in response to an issue or potential claim arising out of or related to the Agreement to which Firm's insurance obligations hereunder may apply or possibly help mitigate) may be treated as a material breach of the Agreement. Should at any time Firm not maintain the insurance coverages required. City at its sole option (but without any obligation or waiver of its rights) may (i) terminate the Agreement or (ii) purchase such coverages as City deems necessary to protect itself (charging Firm for same) and at City's option suspending Firm's performance until such coverage is in place. If Firm does not reimburse City for such costs within 10 days after demand, in addition to any other rights. City shall also have the right to offset such costs from amounts due Firm under any agreement with the City. All provisions intended to survive or to be performed subsequent to the expiration or termination of the Agreement shall survive, including without limitation Firm's obligation to maintain or renew coverage, provide evidence of coverage and certified copies of policies, etc. upon City's request and/or in response to a potential claim, litigation, etc.

The City reserves the right from time to time to modify or waive any or all of these insurance requirements (or to reject policies) based on the specific nature of goods/services to be provided, nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage, financial condition, failure to operate legally, or other special circumstances. If Firm maintains broader coverage and/or higher limits than the minimums shown herein, the City requires and shall be entitled to such broader coverage and/or higher limits maintained by Firm. Any available insurance proceeds in excess of the specified minimum limits of insurance and coverage shall be available to the City. No representation is made that the minimum insurance requirements are sufficient to cover Firm's interests, liabilities, or obligations. Required insurance shall not limit Firm's liability.

Firm acknowledges and agrees Firm and not the City is the party in the best position to determine applicability (e.g. "IF APPLICABLE"), confirm, and/or verify its insurance coverage. Acceptance by the City, or by any of its employees, representatives, agents, etc. of certificates or other documentation of insurance or policies pursuant to the terms of this document and the Agreement evidencing insurance coverages and limits does not constitute approval or agreement that the insurance requirements have been met or that coverages or policies are in compliance. Furthermore, receipt, acceptance, and/or approval of certificates or other documentation of insurance or policies or copies of policies by the City, or by any of its employees, representatives, agents, etc., which indicate less coverage than required does not constitute a waiver of Firm's obligation to fulfill these insurance requirements.

### MINIMUM SCOPE AND LIMIT OF INSURANCE 1

- A. Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance on the most current Insurance Services Office (ISO) Form CG 00 01 or its equivalent on an "occurrence" basis (Modified Occurrence or Claims Made forms are not acceptable without prior written consent of the City). plane/ship repairer, providing safe berth, air/watercraft storage/docking (on land/ in water), fueling, tours, charters, ferries, dredges, tugs, mooring, towing, boat/aircraft equipment/repair/alteration/maintenance, etc.; cover- age against liability for damage to vehicles air/watercraft, their machinery in Firm's care. custody, or control both private & commercial, Limits at least equal to greater of \$1M, value of max number of vehicles that may be in Firm's custody, or of most costly object in Firm's custody. (IF APPLICABLE)

- 0. Liquor Liability/Host Liquor Liability where Firm directly or indirectly provides alcoholic beverages, limits of at least \$1M per occurrence and \$1M aggregate. (IF APPLICABLE)
- P. Educators Legal Liability Insurance where day care, after school program, recreational activities, etc. limits per G above. (IF APPLICABLE)

#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Firm's maintenance of insurance coverage as required herein is a material element of the Agreement and the failure to maintain or renew coverage or provide evidence of same (defined to include without limitation Firm's affirmative duty to provide from time to time upon City's request certificates of insurance complete and certified copies of Firm's insurance policies, forms, and endorsements, information on the amount of claims payments or reserves chargeable to the aggregate amount of coverage(s) whether during the term of the Agreement or after as may be requested by the City in response to an issue or potential claim arising out of or related to the Agreement to which Firm's insurance obligations hereunder may apply or possibly help mitigate) may be treated as a material breach of the Agreement. Should at any time Firm not maintain the insurance coverages required, City at its sole option (but without any obligation or waiver of its rights) may (i) terminate the Agreement or (ii) purchase such coverages as City deems necessary to protect itself (charging Firm for same) and at City's option suspending Firm's performance until such coverage is in place. If Firm does not reimburse City for such costs within 10 days after demand, in addition to any other rights, City shall also have the right to offset such costs from amounts due Firm under any agreement with the City. All provisions intended to survive or to be performed subsequent to the expiration or termination of the Agreement shall survive, including without limitation Firm's obligation to maintain or renew coverage, provide evidence of coverage and certified copies of policies, etc. upon City's request and/or in response to a potential claim, litigation, etc.

<u>DEDUCTIBLES/ SELF-INSURED RETENTIONS (SIR)</u> — must be disclosed to City and, if over \$500,000, approved by the City in advance and in writing, including at City's option being guaranteed, reduced, or eliminated (additionally if a SIR provides a financial guarantee guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses). Upon City's request, Firm shall furnish complete and certified copies of such entities' insurance policies, forms, and endorsements.

SUBCONTRACTOR DEFAULT INSURANCE CONTROLLED INSURANCE PROGRAM, WRAP-UP. Use requires express prior written consent of City Risk Manager.

UNAVAILABILTIY-To the fullest extent permitted by law, if Firm is out of business or otherwise unavailable at the time a claim is presented to City, Firm hereby assigns to the City all of its right, title and interest (but not any liabilities or obligations) under any applicable policies of insurance.

<u>WAIVER OF SUBROGATION</u> — With regard to any policy of insurance that would pay third party losses, Firm hereby grants City a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of Firm may acquire against the City by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Firm agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect such waiver, but this provision shall apply to such policies regardless.
